ROBOULE

Roboule is an exciting new game that can be played by people of all ability levels, including those with multiple disabilities. The concept of bowls having to go under arches on a standing target is also a straightforward one for people with a severe intellectual disability to understand, while a more advanced rule system for the game provides a challenge to the skills of even proficient bowlers.

Equipment



The bowling carpet for Roboule is 2 metres wide and between 8 and 15 metres long. A mobile standing target, the 'bridge' with 3 different size circles ('rims') on its lower edge, is placed against a firm wall at one end of the carpet. Blue, yellow and green cards, representing different scores, slot into place above each arch. Nonbiased black and brown Scottish Carpet Bowls are used for play. For those able to bowl from hand a standard size bowling mat is used, while severely disabled players may use a bowling stand onto which a carpeted slope is hooked. The stand is divided into 3 equal parts by white lines on the delivery surface. (For a fuller description of the equipment see the detailed specifications at the the back of the booklet).
